

## Windows 8 Consumer Preview & Virtualbox

Microsoft has released the Consumer Preview of Windows 8. You may download and install it from this link: <http://windows.microsoft.com/en-US/windows-8/download>. However, I would think that you would want to do it in some sort of Virtual PC setup and not overwrite your current Windows OS.

Based on advice in our meetings from Merle Nicholson, I went to <https://www.virtualbox.org/> and downloaded and installed VirtualBox. I then downloaded

the Win 8 iso file from the above Microsoft address and had VirtualBox add it as a new virtual machine, with Windows 8 as the guest operating system.

As for the settings I chose:

- a Base Memory of 2,048 MB
- a dynamically allocated hard disk of 20 GB
- a Network attached to a Bridged Adapter

You want the hard disk to be dynamically allocated so that it will actually consume only as much as needed of your actual hard drive and then expand as needed up to the maximum you have indicated, 20 MB in my case. Unfortunately, it turned out that 20 MB was not enough when I wanted to install such programs as MS Office, Visual Studio and Photoshop. More on how I



solved that problem later. Using the Bridged Adapter instead of the default NAT, gave the virtual drive easy access to my local area network. This is important if you want to exchange files between the rest of your network and the virtual operating system. Once you have your Virtual Machine up and running, you may also use the option under Devices to “Install Guest Additions.” This will allow you to create some shared folders on the host computer. You may also use the CD/DVD drive of the host computer and, in theory, use the USB connected devices of the host computer.

Once you have the new VM created, you use the Win 8 Consumer Preview iso file that you downloaded from Microsoft to install the Windows 8 operating system on it. You will need a Product Key, which is available under “Need help?” in the FAQ where you got the iso file. To save you the trouble, it is: DNJXJ-7XBW8-2378T-X22TX-BKG7J.

On booting into Win 8, you are presented with a window with a bunch of fairly large icons representing some of the apps available. This is certainly not the Windows 7 desktop. And there is no Start button, a major complaint. So how do you get a list of all your apps and programs? Take your mouse down to the bottom of the screen and right-click, and you will be presented with an All apps icon as pictured below. Simply click on it to get a list of everything, pictured in the large screen capture at the beginning of this article, where you see the left-hand side of the listing of all the apps and programs installed in my Win 8 setup. The ones like Calendar, Camera, Finance,



Messaging, Music, etc. are Win 8 apps. Anything to do with Adobe, Microsoft Office and Visual Studio are programs (not apps) that I installed.

The Photoshop program is actually Adobe Photoshop CS6 Beta. Visual Studio is Visual Studio 11 Express Beta and Microsoft Office is the Microsoft Office 2007 Ultimate. Photoshop CS 6 Beta and Office do not need Win 8; however, Visual Studio 11 Express Beta does (full Visual Studio 11 Beta does not need Win 8; however, it will run on Win 8).

At some point, when installing Photoshop I think it was, the installation failed, and it traced it to not having a large enough hard drive for the Virtual Machine. 20 GB was just not large enough to hold everything I wanted. A search on the Internet, revealed that I needed to do two things. First, on the host computer I should run at the command line an executable for Virtualbox that would allocate whatever size drive I desired to the Virtual Machine. I wanted to double it to 40 GB. The actual command (executed from the directory where VBoxManage.exe was located) is:

```
VBoxManage modifyhd "D:\VirtualBox VMs\Windows8Preview\Windows8Preview.vdi" --resize 40000
```

D:\VirtualBox VMs\Windows8Preview\Windows8Preview.vdi" is the path to my vdi file and 40000 indicating that I wanted a 40 GB drive.

After that was accomplished, I needed to go into Disk Management in Control Panel in Win 8 (just like you would do in Win 7) and expand the current drive, which was still 20 GB, to take up the entire 40 GB now available, as indicated in the screen capture on page 5. The next screen capture at the top of page 6 displays the result of expanding drive C to use the extra space. After that, the installation of Photoshop CS6 Beta went forward flawlessly. As with each iteration of Photoshop, new features are added. Once I had about all the programs loaded that I wanted



to use to test Win 8, what next? Well, the first thing one needs to learn is how to navigate. Recall there is no Start button (at least at this time). First, if you are on the Start Menu, there is a Desktop icon with a fish on it (I think it is the Beta fish). Clicking on that will produce the Desktop, which, if you have not added any icons to it, is pretty bare. I have now added a number of icons to my desktop, but, as I recall, it started out with an Internet Explorer (IE) icon and





- WINKEY + E – Switch to the (classic) Windows desktop and launch Windows Explorer with Computer view displayed.



- WINKEY + F – Display File Search pane

a Files icon in what I would call the task bar at the bottom. Note that you actually have two versions of IE, IE 10 in the apps Start Menu and IE 9 on the Desktop. The apps version does not support Flash or Silverlight.

The best method I have found for navigation is using the Windows key in combination with another key; for example, WINKEY alone toggles you between the apps Start page and the Desktop. Here are a few I use:

- WINKEY + D – Switch to the (classic) Windows desktop and toggle Show Desktop (hides/shows any applications and other windows).



My Win 8 desktop looks like the screen capture to the left. If I want to view the files, I simply use WINKEY + E if I am in the Start Menu or Desktop. Additionally in the Desktop, I have a Files icon on which to click. In the screen capture above, you see a Windows Explorer screen that looks very much like Windows 7. Even though I am running Win 8 in a Virtual Machine, I have had no trouble installing any program that I have tried. I have been able to see my local network, use the printers on the network and use the Internet connection. The

only thing I have not been able to make work is using a camera attached to the computer. However, this, I am sure, is because I am running inside a Virtual Machine. ♦


